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

Overview

Today, providers are scrambling to ensure adequate operational capability and infrastructure amidst the unique requirements created by the COVID-19 pandemic that has swept the world.

Providers must collaborate to address COVID-19 while setting up a model for future population health management and larger scale community care.

In order to tackle these challenges, providers should consider the following two-pronged approach:

Prioritize addressing immediate COVID-19 concerns to save lives and limit the spread

Leverage COVID-19 initiatives and relief dollars to ensure strategic and operational readiness for long-term financial sustainability

How Health Systems Can Deliver the Right Care and Support Physicians

Immediate Tactics and Strategies

What can providers do now to address immediate COVID-19 concerns, deliver the right care and support physicians?

1

Access funds through the CARES Act

Financial viability is of the utmost importance, needing adequate funding and resources to care for the patients. 2

Invest in networks and remote care models

Health systems need to invest in the right tools and technology to provide care management that engages physicians, remote family members and other caregivers to keep their patients safe at home.

3

Increase collaboration

The Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) and the federal antitrust enforcement agencies have relaxed regulations and streamlined oversight to promote procompetitive clinical collaboration.

Accessing Funds Through CARES Act

The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act provides \$100 billion of emergency funding for providers, hospitals and health systems to support operations and address the negative financial impact of COVID-19.



Eligibility

Medicare and Medicaid suppliers and providers



Application

Federal government has not created or released an application at this time



Distribution

Funds will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis



Strategize How to Use CARES Funds

How can providers use the federal funds most effectively and strategically?

Select immediate priorities for patients within a determined market that could serve the communities post COVID-19

Identify the key health providers in the market: physicians, hospitals, home health agencies, public health sources, etc.

Bring together key leaders to decide on one to three priorities

Develop strategies and tactics to be used to meet each priority

Priority:

Epidemic and pandemic preparedness collaborative

Source of Funds:

CARES Act – emergency supplemental appropriations roughly \$330 billion

Create Task Force:

Representatives from key entities

Goal:

Develop a center for the determined market that will have an inventory of supplies and equipment for emergencies

Launching or Expanding Remote Care Models



Providers are
encouraging patients
to stay home and
avoid their offices or
hospitals



Telemedicine has been used for episodic care and does not typically include engagement from families and caregivers



The right tools and technology provides continuous home-based care management that engages remote family members and other caregivers



Grants are available for the development of collaborative telehealth programs under the "Marshall Plan" for healthcare systems

Network and Physician Solvency Strategies

Potential support opportunities for all physicians

Opportunity for redeployment and reassignment of physicians to other areas of the health care system



Opportunity for collaboration in hospital/health system COVID-19 activities, fill care needs, locum tenens, etc.

Local & Regional Collaboration through Clinical Integration



CMS and FTC/ DOJ released guidance that encourages hospitals, health systems and medical groups to collaborate with each other in response to COVID-19

CMS and FTC/DOJ supporting procompetitive collaborations



The new "rules" provide a lawful, clinically effective and market ready means for coordinating and rationalizing health care services across communities

Making a larger community impact



Local & Regional Collaboration through Clinical Integration



Blanket waivers temporarily permit payments and referrals between physicians and DHS entities if the relationship falls into one of CMS' stated "COVID-19 Purpose" categories during the pandemic

Stark Law blanket waivers



Opportunity to use clinical integration to rapidly establish a cross-community COVID-19 "safety net" with other health systems that could later serve as a sustainable model for regional collaboration

Coordinate between community and employed physicians


Rapid access and deployment of COVID-19 testing

Coordinate transportation among facilities

Compile protective gear and supplies, approach local manufacturers to repurpose production

Enduring Impact of Local/Regional Cooperation

Paving the road for long-term success with population health management, value-based payment (VBP) and overall financial sustainability



- Maintain capacity and access for treatment in the community
- Build a platform to reduce cost and improve quality in a sustainable fashion
- Establish durable strategic alliances among the region's hospitals, physicians and other health care providers
- Provide direct or indirect practice support by aligning incentives and engaging physicians
- Utilize networks to collaborate around future health pandemics
- Long term strategy for operational and financial stability

How to Implement a Clinical Integration Strategy During COVID-19

Steps Toward Clinical Collaboration/Integration

- 1 Resolve to pursue a common vision for clinical collaboration
 - 2 Connect with targeted partners in the community
 - 3) Identify opportunities for collaboration and integration
 - 4 Prioritize key issues to address and solve together
- 5 Execute and formalize new partnerships
